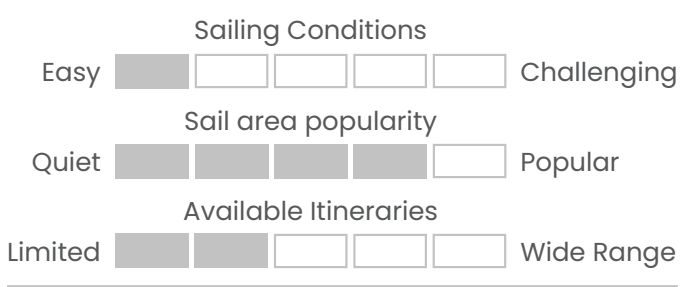
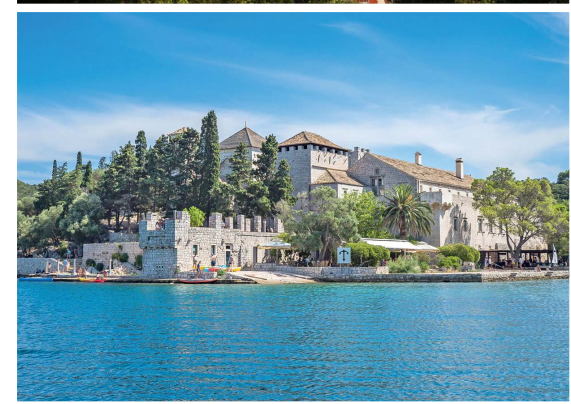

From Dubrovnik you can visit the Elphati islands, Mljet, Lastovo, Korcula and the Peljesac peninsula. It's also common to do a one-way trip running between Dubrovnik & Split in either direction. Whilst this might incur a slight additional fee it makes for an excellent itinerary!
